Class 1:

Marco's Ports of Call

Free-standing stretch design using all fresh plant material, including Iris, staged on table space 30" wide by 30" deep.

Class 2:

Persian Passion

Free-standing design staged on table space 30" wide by 30" deep. Must include fresh Iris. Designers Choice of other components.

Class 3:

Routes of Silk and Spice

Free-standing creative line or creative line-mass design staged on a table space 30" wide by 30" deep. Must include fresh Iris. May include dried and/or treated materials

Glossary

Creative Line Design—a design in which line direction is dominant, characterized by open silhouette, a minimum of plant material and other (optional) components. Dominant feature is the thrusting movement in a single direction, either vertically, horizontally or diagonally.

Creative Line-Mass Design—a design as described for a Creative Line Design, except additional plant material and other (optional) components are included to add strength and depth to the design. Due to the use of additional components, contrast of line, form, color, and texture plays an important role.

Free-standing Design—a design that is created to be viewed from all sides.

Stretch Design—a creative design in two units, one smaller than the other, having a prominent component connecting the two units and referred to as the "stretched component".

General Information

Iris must be INCLUDED in every design.

- ◆ **Advance Entry Required. Limit four designs per class. Call Advance Entry Chairman Gale Baullinger by May 7.**
- ◆ **Entry Time:** Enter all divisions between 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 14. Late entries will not be accepted. All entries must be checked for conformity to the schedule.
- ◆ **Removal Time:** Entries must be removed at 4:00 p.m., Saturday, May 14. Early removals are not allowed.

Rules

1. **Advance entry required. Limit four designs per class. Call Advance Entry Chairman Gale Baullinger by May 7.**
2. **IRIS must be included in every design.**
3. **All classes call for a Free-standing design and will be judged from all sides.**
4. Exhibitors must provide substitute if unable to participate.
5. An exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired, but only one exhibit per class.
6. Each design must be the work of one individual.
7. No artificial flowers, fruit or foliage permitted.
8. All designs must contain some plant material. Fresh plant material should be emphasized.
9. Fresh plant material may never be treated or embellished in any way.
10. Dried plant material may be treated, painted or embellished.
11. Living plants with exposed roots and/or moss attached and plants growing in containers are permitted.
12. Accessories, featured objects and draping are permitted.
13. Designer may provide additional staging but must use the properties provided and use only the space allowed.
